Welcome back to another school year, we are excited to have our students back on-site learning in the classroom with their peers and teachers. I hope that all of our families had the opportunity to spend time doing the things they enjoy most over the break.

STAFFING

We will be employing a Learning Tutor at the end of this term.

The school has appointed Elizabeth Richardson to the Acting Assistant Principal role for term 1. Elizabeth brings with her a wealth of knowledge and expertise, which will support our whole school community.

SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

During the year the school will be working to embed Sentral within all school functions, providing a single platform for all school communication. This will happen gradually, and parents will be provided with guides as each new function is activated. Please ensure that you have the Sentral app on your phone and your account linked to your students to ensure you receive all relevant communication.

Class Dojo will continue to be utilised to support communication until additional functions within Sentral are activated throughout term 1.

BACK TO SCHOOL PLAN

**HERE ARE SOME THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW:**

Year 1- 6 Students

Due to COVID19 restrictions, unfortunately parents and families are not able to enter the school grounds. A quick goodbye at the gate is recommended to reduce congestion of families. Please be mindful to follow COVID19 Guidelines and keep your physical distance of 1.5 meters and where possible, please wear masks.

FOUNDATION

For the first week only (Thursday 3rd & Friday 4th), Foundation students will have a revised start and finish time of 9:05am – 3:05pm. This is to reduce the congestion of families and students as well as to welcome the Foundation students into the school in a manner that they deserve.

One parent can enter with their child and meet the Foundation teachers on the school oval. At the end of the day, Foundation Teachers will take students back to the oval where they will be dismissed back into your care.

Please remember that Foundation Students do not attend school on Wednesdays for the month of February.

GENERAL REMINDERS FOR ALL STUDENTS

- School hats are to be worn in Term 1 to follow our SunSmart Policy.
- We have a high expectation of all students wearing the school uniform every day. If a child is not in full school uniform, then please let your child's teacher know the reason.
- School starts at 8:50 am and therefore student learning starts at 8:55 am. Any students who arrive after 8:55 am must go through the office and sign in using the iPad kiosk.
- Please ensure you label your child's uniform, hat, reader bag, drink bottle & lunchbox with their full name. We always have a lot of lost property and if it doesn't have a name on it, we cannot return it to the owner.
- Please remember to keep your child's food in containers as much as possible to reduce the rubbish in our school, as we like to be proud of our school grounds.

COVID19 Guidelines Update

The measures set out in the Victorian Government back to school plan will ensure every possible effort is made to ensure staff and students are safe and that schools remain open. The plan maintains the importance of the 3 V's – Ventilation, Vaccination and Vital COVID Safe Steps and introduces some new measures.

Free rapid antigen tests (a box of 5) are available for every student and staff member. Another pack will be made available in Week 3 once they arrive at school.

It is recommended that students do the test at home twice a week. Any positive results must be reported to the school and the Department of Health immediately. Students must then isolate for 7 days and not attend school during this time. Household contacts of a positive case will also need to isolate for 7 days.

As per the advice of the Department of Education, if students are isolating due to a positive result, schools are not expected to provide a remote learning program during this time. Any student who tests positive will be supported to continue their learning from home by DET. More information about this is available from their website.

Years 3 and above must always wear a face mask indoors at school. Years F-2 are strongly encouraged to wear one.

Student Accident Insurance and insurance for personal items

Every year we have students who accidentally hurt themselves whilst at school. This can be very expensive for parents.

Our school does not have insurance for student accidents or loss/damage of personal items.

Parents/carers can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers. You can search for providers on the Internet. It is quite cheap and well worth the money.

Parents/carers of students, who **do not** have student accident insurance, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.


If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.





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Set up your account


- 1 **Download the Flexischools App**
Note: for iPhone and iPad please select 'Allow' notifications.
- 2 **Login/Register**
 - **Already a Flexischools user** – Enter your details and login. To save your login details select 'remember me'.
 - **New Flexischools user** – Click 'Register', enter your email address and follow the instructions in the email to set up your account. Once your account is set up, add new student; search for their school, enter student details and select their class.
- 3 **Top Up Your Account**
 To make ordering fast and simple, you can set up automatic top ups in your 'User Profile'.

Order

- 1 **Place your Order**
 On the app home screen, scroll down to view your school services such as canteen and uniforms. Then **swipe left and right** to view all available services.
- 2 **Make your Selection**
 Find the service and press 'Order', then select the items you wish to order.
- 3 **Make Payment**
 Select your payment option and complete payment to place your order.

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ASTHMA FIRST AID

- 1**  **SIT THE PERSON UPRIGHT**

 - Be calm and reassuring
 - Do not leave them alone
- 2**  **GIVE 4 SEPARATE PUFFS OF BLUE/ GREY RELIEVER PUFFER**

 - Shake puffer
 - Put **1 puff** into spacer
 - Take **4 breaths** from spacer
 - Repeat until **4 puffs** have been taken


OR give 2 separate inhalations of Bricanyl (6 years or older)
 OR give 1 inhalation of Symbicort Turbuhaler (12 years or older)
 OR give 2 puffs of Symbicort Rapihaler through a spacer (12 years or older)

If no spacer available: Take 1 puff as you take 1 slow, deep breath and hold breath for as long as comfortable. Repeat until all puffs are given
- 3**  **WAIT 4 MINUTES**

 - If there is no improvement, **give 4 more separate puffs of blue/grey reliever** as above

OR give 1 more inhalation of Bricanyl
 OR give 1 more inhalation of Symbicort Turbuhaler
 OR give 2 puffs of Symbicort Rapihaler through a spacer

IF THERE IS STILL NO IMPROVEMENT

- 4**  **DIAL TRIPLE ZERO (000)**

 - Say **'ambulance'** and that someone is having an asthma attack
 - Keep giving **4 separate puffs every 4 minutes** until emergency assistance arrives

OR give 1 inhalation of a Bricanyl or Symbicort Turbuhaler every 4 minutes – up to a max of 4 more inhalations of Symbicort Turbuhaler
 OR give 2 puffs of Symbicort Rapihaler through a spacer every 4 minutes – up to a max of 8 more puffs of Symbicort Rapihaler

CALL EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE IMMEDIATELY AND DIAL TRIPLE ZERO (000) IF:

- the person is not breathing
- the person's asthma suddenly becomes worse or is not improving
- the person is having an asthma attack and a reliever is not available
- you are not sure if it is asthma
- **the person is known to have anaphylaxis – follow their Anaphylaxis Action Plan, then give Asthma First Aid**

Blue/grey reliever medication is unlikely to harm, even if the person does not have asthma.
