SENTRAL

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KITCHEN PROGRAM RECIPE

Spinach Pici Pasta

Ingredients

200g baby spinach

300g Tipo OO or plain flour



Method

- **1.** In a food processor, blitz the spinach and flour until a ball of dough forms, letting the machine do all the work. Touch the dough it shouldnt be sticky, you want playdough consistency.
- **2.** To make the pici, simply tear off 2cm balls of dough and roll them out into thin sausage shapes on a clean surface.
- **3.** Cook pici in a large pot of salted water for about 5 minutes.



COVID-19 UPDATE

The Victorian Government has announced that additional COVID Safe measures will be in place from today.

Changes include new limits to public and private gatherings and changes to mask wearing.

Schools will remain open with the current restrictions that are in place.

Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS)

With assistance from the Government, Medicare has introduced a Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS) that provides children access to bee onental services from the ages of 2-17 years old. The entitlement is tapped at \$1,013 per child for every two calendaryest period.

To be eligible, you on the child must be claiming one of the following benefits: FarMy Tax Benefits-Part A, Farenting Payment, Abstudy, Youth Allowance, Carer's Payment, Disability Support Pension, Apedial Benefits, or Double Orphan Pension. To enquire ("your child is eligible, please contact. Medicare on 132-011.

Once your child's forms have been returned to your school and received by us, we will tak Moually check each child's eligibility to see if the thread man be bulk billed through Medicare.

(Fyour child is **not eligible** for the CDBS funding, Teeth On Wheels can offer a special deal that is only available through your school for a check-up, clean and fluorice treatment (und x-rays if required) for only **\$99** (pre-payment required) which can be up to 30% cheaper then a private practice.

Our service also provides children to be seen under **Private Health Insurance**, es most providers will offer two free check-upsi and clean per family member each calendar year. To make a claim, you pay \$99 to Teeth On Wheels and we will provide you will you revolve to claim your treatment back Larough your Private Health Fund.


