Sentral will automatically let parents know when their child is marked absent. 2022 Foundation Student Transition Sessions



We have received notification from the Department of Education that we can now run onsite transition sessions at the school. Please find information about the revised transition sessions within this letter.

During these onsite sessions, students will participate in a number of exciting activities that allow the children to become familiar with their new environment and to get to know our staff and their peers. They will spend time getting to know the current Foundation teachers, their classmates and become more confident with the transition to school. The group sessions will run for 1 hour. Our current online sessions will now be suspended.

Through this program, teachers have an opportunity to meet new students and make observations that will assist in the preparation of teaching and learning programs for next year and to create well balanced student groupings.

Due to current restrictions, please arrive at the school office **only at your designated time**. Please only have one adult accompanying a child. You will be required to sign your child in and leave an emergency contact number. Staff will then take the students to the classroom to begin the session. Parents and guardians are then asked to leave the school grounds and return to collect their child from **the oval** near the school entrance at the session finish time. Please adhere to social distancing regulations, wear a face covering and practise hand hygiene when in the school grounds.
